# Harbor Ceremony Set For Monday

An original folk song about Dana Cove will be sung publicly for the first time Monday in the historic pageant depicting trading of the hides during harbor rock-dropping ceremonies, Orange County Harbor Engineer James Ballinger announced.

Jim and Mary Jenkins and their folk-singing group will accompany their singing with instruments, led by a harmonica, that were generally available to the merchant marine during the 1830 period. This was the setting depicted by Richard Henry Dana in "Two Years Before the Mast."

Set for 4:45 p.m. at the north end of Doheny Beach State Park, the harbor fete should attract a crowd of 1500, Ballinger predicted. Free admission to the park will be offered after 4 p.m.

He described the time capsule container, to be filled during the ceremony, as a 10-ton rock, five by three by three feet in size. In a hole drilled through the center a stainless steel tube waits insertion of material from area organizations, to be cemented up and covered with a bronze plaque suggesting it be opened again in 50 years.

Each organization's representative will be photographed placing

his or her material in the capsule, and the group will receive a copy of the special photo. Photography is being provided by Laguna Federal Savings and Loan Assn.

During the pageant "Indians" will circulate through the crowd, distributing commemorative cards which are printed as free tickets to time capsule opening ceremonies in the year 2016.

A design commissioned by Les Remmers, incorporating the mission arch and a replica of Dana's brig "Pilgrim" — signifying unity of the Capistrano Valley, will grace all signs, programs and written material connected with the celebration, including the bronze plaque.

The flag to be raised will be one which once flew over the United States Capitol. A concert by the 72nd Army Band from Fort MacArthur in San Pedro will open the program.

An exhibit of harbor maps and plans, Corps of Army Engineer projects and historic documents will be available for public viewing.

The Coast Assn. has arranged the barbecue that will follow at 6:15. It will be catered by the Gaslight Broiler of Laguna Beach, Historic Pageant (See Page 2)
